



## **Parent/Guardian Reopening Feedback - July 2020**

This survey was conducted between July 15th and 19th and received 4,431 Responses.

July 24, 2020

In mid-july, WRSD parents and guardians were asked to provide feedback on potential plans for reopening school in the fall. We received over 4,000 responses which is an excellent response rate and provides for a large sample size from which to draw conclusions.

Of note, when presented with three possible reopening models, respondents overall were most supportive of a hybrid plan, which would consist of a combination of in-person and remote learning. The model with the least amount of support from families was the full in-person model.

Questions about internet and device access indicate that a number of district families will need support in those areas. Plans are already in place to close those technology gaps and families will have the opportunity to request assistance prior to the start of school.

Overall survey responses are detailed below. As always, we are grateful for your participation in these surveys and for your patience as we continue planning for reopening schools under challenging circumstances.




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
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## Learning Models


If the district implements a 100% in-person learning model with state-mandated safety protocols:

If the District implements a 100% remote learning model:






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


Does your household have internet access?

As a parent, do you anticipate that you will need training or support for the technology tools used in the district in order for your child(ren) to succeed in remote learning?






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## Transportation and Cafeteria
